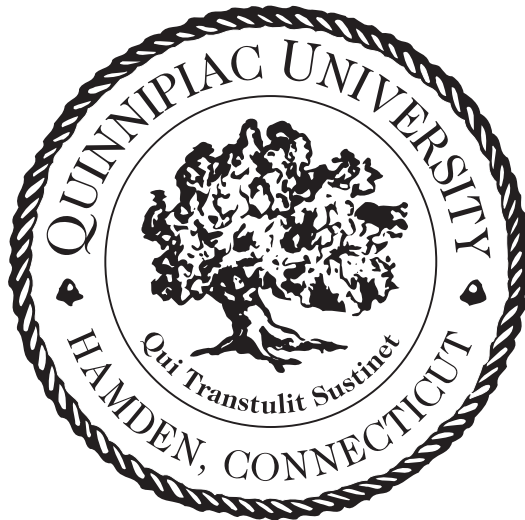

Christine S. Vertefeuille*



Connecticut Supreme Court Justice Christine S. Vertefeuille has distinguished herself for her legal experience, prudent rulings and knowledge of the law. As a member of the state's highest court, she hears cases that address critical legal questions and affect the interpretation of the law and state constitution. Her fairness, common sense and sound opinions are admired by her colleagues and all of the legal community.

A native of New Britain, Conn., Justice Vertefeuille graduated from Trinity College with a bachelor of arts in political science in 1972 and earned a juris doctorate from the University of Connecticut School of Law in 1975. She began her legal career in private practice in New Haven in 1975 and continued until 1989.

In addition to her private practice work, she was a member of the Executive Committee of the Real Property Section of the Connecticut Bar Association (1988–89), the Cheshire Commission on Handicapped and Disabled (1988–89) and an alternate member of the Waterbury and New Haven Grievance Panels (1985–89).

Justice Vertefeuille was appointed to the Superior Court bench in 1989. During her tenure, she presided over the Connecticut silicone gel breast implant cases (1993–99). While serving as a Superior Court judge, she was on the faculty of the Connecticut Judges Institute and has served as a judge for moot court competitions at Quinnipiac University School of Law.

In addition, she served as the administrative judge in the Waterbury Judicial District (1994–99) and as a complex litigation judge (1999).

Her honor was appointed judge of the Appellate Court in September 1999 and administrative judge of the Appellate System in June 2000. She joined the State Supreme Court on January 3, 2000.

## CANDIDATES FOR GRADUATION

Subject to review of all curricular requirements, degrees will be conferred upon all candidates listed herein and any others who meet the graduation requirements. Included in the May 14 ceremony are students who completed the requirements in December 2005 and May 2006, and those who expect to complete their requirements by July 2006.

## AWARDS AND HONORS

Graduates who have been named by the faculty to receive awards are identified in this program. These awards were presented at a ceremony on May 13.

Formal academic honors conferred with degrees, together with a small number of awards dependent solely on academic averages or performance in particular courses, will be announced by the School of Law after final academic averages have been calculated. Students who are expected to graduate with academic honors are noted in this program. This projection is based upon the Fall 2005 grade point average.

# DOCTORAL HOODING CEREMONY

The twelfth and thirteenth centuries saw the formation of universities under the jurisdiction of the Church. Most students of the day were clerks in the Holy Order, monks or priests. Cowls or hoods adorned their habits and protected the young scholars from harsh weather and the pervading dampness of the stone buildings in which they studied. Hoods also served to cover tonsured heads before the use of the skullcap.

Today, the cap, gown and hood have taken on a symbolic meaning. Color and shape conform to an academic code signifying the university's conferral of the degree and the nature of the degree conferred. Gowns for the doctoral degree are designed to be worn open, and they carry velvet panels and three horizontal velvet bars on the upper arm of the full, round, bell-shaped sleeves.

## QUINNIPIAC UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF LAW

The program of studies at the School of Law provides students with excellent preparation for legal practice. The curriculum balances theoretical and skills training and offers students the choice to elect a general course of study or to concentrate their coursework and training in a number of specific practice areas.

Students also have opportunities to apply lessons learned in the classroom to real-world legal problems, in five clinical programs (appellate defense, appellate prosecution, civil, health law and tax) and eight externship programs (corporate counsel, criminal justice, family and juvenile law, legal services, judicial, legislative, mediation and public interest). Faculty members come from a broad spectrum of distinguished backgrounds in legal practice and education and are committed to excellence in scholarship and teaching.

In the tradition of American law schools, the Quinnipiac University School of Law sponsors student-edited scholarly journals—the *Quinnipiac Law Review*, the *Probate Law Journal* and the *Health Law Journal*, which contribute to both student education and legal scholarship. Students are also actively involved in about 30 student organizations in which they share interests, sponsor programs and engage in both social and community service activities.

The School of Law Center, which opened in 1995, has won architectural awards and was selected in a recent survey of Connecticut architects as one of their favorite four buildings in Connecticut.

Throughout its history, the Quinnipiac University School of Law has been devoted to rigorous teaching and has cultivated a reputation for producing highly qualified and skilled attorneys who are capable of assuming leadership roles in law practice, business and government service.
